	1851, at the age of 26 years, where by
	industry and strict attention to business
	he amassed a fortune estimated at \$800,-
	000. He leaves a sister, Mrs. Maria
	Arroqui, a brother, Simon Oxarart, at
	Santa Gertrudes rancho; a niece, Mrs.
	Maria Save, and a nephew, Simon Gless,
	formerly with A. Vignolo & Co., in this
	city. Mr. Gless is reported to be the
	custodian of the property, which largely
	consists of real estate in this city, in- cluding the postoffice building. He was
	also the proprietor of the Encino rancho
	and held about \$200,000 in French 3 per
	cent. bonds.
	The casket for his remains has been
	prepared by Garrett & Neitze, and is
	probably the finest ever prepared in Los
	Angeles. The funeral will take place on
	Monday, at 9 A. M., from his late resi-
	dence, 43 Boyle Avenue.
