

Death of Well-known Citizen.

Don Ulpiano Yndart died at Santa Barbara in his residence in Victoria street, at 3:15 p.m., November 7, 1902. He was descendant of highly-respected parents from Spain, Norberto Yndart and Carmen Arbura de Yndart. Was born in the City of Fuenterrabia, province of Guipuscoa, Spain, April 2, 1828. He came to California over fifty years ago, and had continuously lived in the State, most of the time in Santa Barbara, where he was well known and universally liked and respected, both in the city and county. For years occupied with distinction the office of County Treasurer and also City Treasurer. He was married twice, his first wife, Dona Feliciana Yndart, was an accomplished and polished lady, renowned for her jovial and charitable characteristics. She died in the sixties. Of this marriage only one issue was left, the amiable and highly-respected lady, Mrs. Blanche Maguire, now living with her two charming daughters at 507 1/2 West First in this city. His second wife is a member of that old distinguished and aristocratic family, the De la Guerra, of Santa Barbara.

From this marriage two beautiful and accomplished daughters are left, Miss Azela and Miss Teresa, well known in Santa Barbara society.
