

CONSTABLE W. J. TEBO DISPROVES RUMORS OF FOUL PLAY IN THE DEATH OF PIERRE OURET

Although the hanging of Pierre Ouret, whose lifeless body was found suspended from a rafter at the F. H. Slaughter barn on Prado road early Monday morning, was apparently a suicide, Constable W. J. Tebo conducted a thorough investigation into all the obtainable evidence and it was only after exhausting every possible angle of the situation that he made announcement that he was thoroughly satisfied that there had been no foul play.

It is said that there were some circumstances connected with the life

of the dead man which undoubtedly had some influence upon his decision to end his life, but which were subject to interpretation as clues that might lead to the establishment of a theory of murder. One of these is a letter which was supposed to have been placed in the mail before he committed the rash act and which arrived at its destination some time during Monday, the day on which the body was found. The contents of this letter, if it does exist, have been kept from the public and are not available for publication.
