

**DAGUERRE FOR YEARS
RANCHER AT EL TORO**

Jean Pierre Daguerre died in a Los Angeles hospital Friday evening as a result of the accident sustained in a runaway which occurred the week previous. The accident happened on the road half way between El Toro and San Juan Capistrano, near the Oso canyon.

Daguerre, who, in partnership with Louis Moulton, owns a large ranch near El Toro, consisting of about 23,000 acres, was looking after his business in connection with the cattle and sheep raising of the ranch. At the top of the hill at the Oso canyon he met a shepherd, and was giving him some instructions about his work. Daguerre was driving a fine pair of horses which had a great deal of life in them.

While talking to the shepherd, an automobile approached, and Daguerre told the shepherd to stand at the head of his team. As the machine got nearer, and made a great racket, the team took fright and lunged forward. The shepherd let go of the horses and they plunged down the hill. One single tree was broken, and the tongue dropped to the ground. Daguerre was thrown from the rig and his chest was crushed in.

On Friday he was taken to a hospital in Los Angeles, where he died.

Daguerre leaves a widow and a son, Domingo, and three daughters.

The death of Daguerre takes a very picturesque character from the affairs of the southern part of the county. For about sixteen years in the past Daguerre and Moulton operated the big ranch.
