

SILENT CALL IS ANSWERED BY POMONA PIONEER

Yesterday marked the passing of another pioneer of Pomona, when James Tisnerat, commonly known as "Jack," died in his chair while reading his morning paper.

Mr. Tisnerat was a native of France, being born in 1852. He came to America in 1887, settling in Pomona, at the south end of Thomas street, where he has resided ever since.

Besides his wife he leaves two sons, Peter and Eugene Tisnerat, and two daughters, Miss Eunice Tisnerat, who lives at the family home, and Mrs. W. W. Wildman, of Los Angeles. There are also two brothers, Zachariah Tisnerat, of West Third street, and another brother at a distance.

Funeral services will be held at the residence at 2 p. m., Wednesday, and interment will be in the Pomona cemetery, by Todd & Patterson.
