

**PETER HASQUET
PASSES AFTER A
LONG ILLNESS**

The death of Peter Hasquet, one of the early settlers in this section, occurred last Saturday, June 5, at the Columbus hospital in Great Falls. Death was caused by cancer, from which the deceased had been a sufferer for a long time.

Funeral services were held in this city on Tuesday morning, June 8, at 10 o'clock. High requiem mass was held by Rev. Fr. Heitpas, acting as deacon, the Rev. Fr. Hanna of Conrad and the Rev. Fr. Greven, of Cut Bank. A children's choir sang beautifully during the services. Interment was made in the local cemetery. Active pallbearers were Thos. Costello, L. N. Eckel, E. Mallette, M. Connelly, Sylva Murray, W. Dumas. A very large funeral procession followed the hearse to the cemetery to pay last respects to a friend and neighbor of many years' standing.

The deceased was born in Arneguy, France, 38 years ago. He came to this country when a boy, going first to Buffalo, N. Y., and coming to this city in 1906. For the past 15 years he has been one of the well-known ranchmen from the Fowler district.

This was the fourth death in the Hasquet family within the past ten months. Last August Mr. and Mrs. Michael Hasquet were killed in the crossing accident, and only three weeks ago Lolita Hasquet, 7 years old, and a daughter of Peter, died of pneumonia. The news of the little girl's death was kept from her father at that time, as the shock would undoubtedly have hastened his end. Two of the three surviving children have been confined in the Conrad hospital for the past three weeks but are improving. Besides the children, Mr. Hasquet is survived by the wife, and two brothers, John and Jean, and also by an aged father in France. The sympathy of the community is extended them in their sorrow.
