

## Peggy Hurst Is Married At Elko Rite

At an elaborate double ring ceremony performed at the First Presbyterian church in Elko on June 2, Miss Peggy Gene Hurst and Henry Etchemendy were married by the Rev. James W. Baird.

Mrs. Etchemendy is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Willard Hurst of Twin Falls, Idaho, while the bridegroom is the son of Martin Etchemendy of Eureka.

The altar was decorated with large baskets of white peonies, while white satin bows were attached to the church pews.

The bride wore a gown of white satin made with a full skirt and long train. The yoke of the dress was of marquisette, and her fingertip veil was held in place by a high crown of seed pearls. She carried a white prayer book topped with a white orchid from which well narrow white ribbons with white baby orchids knotted at intervals.

Matron of honor was the bride's sister, Mrs. Manford Glock, who wore pale green with a very full skirt of net. Bridesmaid was Miss Mary Etchemendy, sister of the bridegroom, who wore a dress of pink net in the same fashion as the matron of honor. Both attendants carried bouquets of white daisies with matching head-dress.

Best man was Albert Hachquet, and ushers were Fay Strange and Carl Pacini.

For her daughter's wedding Mrs. Hurst wore a black crepe afternoon dress accented with white lace collar. Her hat was black straw and she wore a corsage of white carnations.

The organ prelude was played by Mrs. John Tellaisha, church organist, while the guests were being seated, and she also accompanied Mrs. Lou Caple who sang "At Dawning" and "God Gave Me You" before the ceremony. The traditional Lohengrin wedding march was played as the party approached the altar.

Immediately following the ceremony a reception was held at the Twentieth Century club in Elko, when the bride cut the three-tiered wedding cake in traditional fashion.

Serving were Mrs. Herbert Hawkins, Mrs. Carl Pacini, and Miss Lorraine Faoletti. Brother of the bridegroom, Martin Etchemendy, was in charge of the guest book, and background music was played during the reception by Miss June Lani.
