

Friends Attend Borda Services

GARDNERVILLE, April 11. — (Special) — Largely-attended funeral services were held from St. Gall's Catholic Church in Gardnerville this week for the late Raymond Borda, prominent western Nevada businessman.

Mr. Borda was one of the most prominent sheepmen in Nevada and northern California and also owned the East Fork Hotel in Carson Valley. He was born in Bidarry, France, April 17, 1894, and had resided in Gardnerville since 1912.

He worked in the sheepraising business, later going into business for himself and acquiring the East Fork Hotel, of which he was owner and manager at the time of his death Friday.

Survivors include his widow, Mrs. Gorgonia Borda; three daughters, Mrs. Eddie Corda, Mrs. Dominic Oxoby and Juanita Borda; four sons, Raymond, Pete, John and Bert Borda; seven grandchildren, Sandra Lee Corda, Ronald E.
