

Retired Elko Rancher Dies

Domingo Mariluch, 68, retired eastern Nevada rancher and resident of Reno for 17 years died at a local hospital Saturday night following an illness of several months.

Mr. Mariluch was a native of France, and was born in Aldudes in 1887. He came to the United States as a youth in 1906 and settled in Elko. Later he entered the livestock business in Elko and Eureka counties, and was engaged in ranching in the two counties for many years.

In 1938 he and his family moved to Reno and he and his wife, Marie, had made their home at 728 North Virginia St. since that time.

Besides his widow Mr. Mariluch is survived by a daughter, Mrs. John R. Callahan; a son Peter J. Mariluch; two grandchildren, Jacquelyn and Rodney Callahan, all of Reno; four brothers, William and J. P. Mariluch both of Elko; John Mariluch, Bakersfield, Calif., and Gracian Mariluch, Aldudes, France; two sisters, Mrs. Marie Portugal and Mary Louise Mariluch, both of Banca, France. A number of nieces and nephews in Ely, Elko, San Francisco and France also survive.
