

Ben Saldubehere Is Fatally Burned

CORNING—Bernard (Ben) Saldubehere, 75, wealthy and prominently known sheepman, died at 5 o'clock this morning from burns received when his home in the Kirkwood district, six miles south of here, was destroyed by fire.

Saldubehere was believed to have been asleep in the house when the fire started, and was removed in a semi-conscious condition and rushed to the hospital.

There was no information available as to how Saldubehere was removed from the burning home or as to how the fire started.

He was a native of Urepel, France, and was born July 17, 1879 and came to the United States about 55 years ago. For many years he was associated in the sheep industry with his brother, John Saldubehere of Corning, but in late years he had been in the sheep business by himself. He had never married.

In addition to his brother, he is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Manuela Argain and Mrs. Lucy Ansolabehere, both of Bakersfield, and brothers and sisters living in France. There are several nieces and nephews, including Mrs. Clarence Martine of this city.

The body is at Hall Brothers' mortuary where funeral arrangements are being delayed pending the arrival of relatives.
