

## Pioneer Sweetwater Sheepman Dies at 80

ROCK SPRINGS — Gaston Erramouspe, 80, well-known retired sheep raiser, died suddenly at his home in Rock Springs Saturday night of an apparent heart attack.

Born in Banca, France, on Sept. 22, 1888, he came to the United States in 1912. He was a U.S. Army veteran of World War I and had served with the French army prior to the conflict.

He married Grace Larre in France on Nov. 10, 1923.

Erramouspe was a member of Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church, Knights of Columbus, American Legion Archie Hay Post 24 and the Wyoming Woolgrowers Association.

Two sons preceded him in death, Pierre, who died in the Pacific Theatre during World War II and Louis, who died in infancy.

Survivors include his wife, Grace, of Rock Springs; three sons, John and Dr. Joseph Erramouspe, both of Rock Springs; and Paul of Boulder, Colo.; six daughters, Sister Miriam Grace of Salt Lake City; Mrs. Roy (Ann) Case, Boulder, Colo.; Mrs. Richard (Catherine) Canestrini, Rock Springs; Mrs. Antone (Bernadette) Gosar, Pinedale; Mrs. Joe (Margaret) Sellyei, Denver; and Grace Erramouspe, St. Louis, Mo.; one brother and one sister, both living in France and 34 grandchildren.
