

Four killed in accidents

A single-car accident Sunday on U.S. Highway 395 south of the Mount Rose Road killed two Reno women, the Nevada Highway Patrol reported.

Two other persons were killed Saturday in a single-car accident on Interstate 80 near Donner Summit.

The victims of the Reno accident were driver Maria Schwartz, 47, of 555 Wonder St. and passenger Elizabeth L. Borda, 39, of 2640 Gellert Drive.

Patrolmen said the driver apparently fell asleep. The car went down an embankment and overturned. The accident happened at 11:04 a.m.

Maria Schwartz had been employed as a cashier at the Ponderosa Hotel. Her only known relatives live in Germany.

Mrs. Borda, a native of Germany, had lived in Reno 13 years. She, also, had

been a cashier and worked at the Silver Spur Casino.

Survivors include her husband William, a building and grounds maintenance man with the Reno Recreation Department; a sister, Caren Sevigny of Reno, and her mother Luise Reissle of Germany.

Services are pending for both women at O'Brien-Rogers and Crosby Funeral Home.

The California Highway Patrol reported the Donner accident claimed the lives of Nancy L. Swanson, 27, of Seaside, Calif. and William C. Holcomb, 21, of Ford Ord, Calif.

Also hurt were driver Robert Swanson, 27, of Fort Ord and Michael A. Swanson, 2. They were treated at Tahoe Forest Hospital at Truckee.

Patrolmen said Swanson also apparently fell asleep while driving east at 12:27 a.m.
