

Buffalo centenarian dies at 101

BUFFALO — Funeral Liturgy for Jeanne Iberlin, 101, will be celebrated Monday at 10 a.m. at St. John's Catholic Church. A rosary will be recited at 7 p.m. at the Catholic church. Rite of Committal will be in the Willow Grove Cemetery.

Mrs. Iberlin died Sept. 2, 1993, at Johnson County Memorial Hospital. She was born March 23, 1892, in Arneguy, France. She moved to Buffalo to join her sister, Catherine Harriet, in September of 1920.

On Aug. 2, 1921, she married John Iberlin in Buffalo. The couple ranched in the Buffalo area. Her husband died in February of 1953, and she continued to live in Buffalo.

Mrs. Iberlin was a member of Navy Mothers and a past member of the Altar and Rosary Society. She enjoyed gardening, sewing, traveling, and especially flying in small airplanes with her son, John.

Survivors include her two sons, John and Simon Iberlin, both of Buffalo; two daughters, Madeline Harriet of Buffalo and Mary L. Arambel of Rock Springs; one brother, Pierre Etchemendy of Arneguy, France; 13 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents, three brothers, two sisters, one grandson, and one great-grandson.
