

Henry Aguerre

Henry John Aguerre, retired diaryman and longtime local resident and volunteer, died suddenly of a heart attack April 25 at the age of 68.

"Hank" Aguerre was born Jan. 5, 1929 in Los Angeles. He had lived in Chino most of his life and graduated from Chino High in 1947. He went to work for the Department of Corrections in 1958, retiring in 1981. He was former co-owner of Aguerre Bros. Dairy, then ran the prison dairy at the California Institution for Men. He was a veteran of the Korean Conflict, serving with the 224th Infantry.

Mr. Aguerre, an ardent golfer, was active in community organizations including Chino High School Booster Club, 20-30 Club, Rancho Ride Committee, treasurer of the Chino Junior Fair Board, president of the Southern California Basque Club. He was a member of the tournament committee of Los Serranos Country Club.

At the time of his death he was helping organize his 50th class reunion. He was a member of St. Margaret Mary Catholic Church in Chino.

Survivors include his wife, Elizabeth; two sons, Mike of North Highland and Marty of Reno; a daughter, Diana Valois of Camarillo; a daughter-in-law, Kelly of Reno; two grandsons, Christopher Aguerre of Key West, Florida and Eric Valois of Camarillo; a brother and sister-in-law Louie and Angela Aguerre of Chino; a sister, Betty Iriart of Ontario; as well as numerous nieces and nephews.

A funeral mass was celebrated Monday morning at St. Margaret Mary Church, followed by entombment at Bellevue Mausoleum in Ontario. Pierce Brothers Griffith Mortuary handled arrangements.
