The Rosary will be recited for Anna Hachquet at 6:30 p.m. tomorrow at Burns Funeral Home. Funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Friday at St. Joseph's Catholic Church with the Rev. Norman King officiating. Burial will follow in the Elko cemetery.

She died yesterday at her Elko home of natural causes. She was born Oct. 8, 1898, in Aldudes, France, and was reared there as the last of 10 children. She came to the United States, and to Elko, in March 1926. She married Martin Hachquet Sr. Nov. 11, 1926, in Elko. She and her husband ran sheep in Elko and Eureka counties for many years.
