

GRAZIDE FUNERAL.

**Pioneer of Old French Colony Will
be Laid at Rest at San Gabriel
Mission Today.**

The funeral of the late Francisco Grazide will be conducted this morning at 10:30 o'clock at the Old Mission San Gabriel. The deceased was one of the best-known Frenchmen of Southern California and was aged 66 years. He succumbed to an attack of heart trouble at his home at Puente. He was one of the largest walnut growers in Southern California, which was but a part of his farming activities on his ranch of 3500 acres. He was well known to all old residents of the city and county and was exceedingly popular. His widow is a niece of former Sheriff William Rowland, and who is now president of the Puente Oil Company. He leaves beside the widow two sons, John and Frank, and three daughters, Mrs Aurelia Pilario, Mrs. Marguerite Pilario and Mrs. Anna Alvarado.

Mr. Grazide was a native of France and came to this country when but a boy. After living in the northern part of the State for a time he came to Southern California and became a sheep herder and has stuck to the farm during forty-six years.
