

## DEATH OF MRS. ISADORE SARA

Young Mother Passes Away Christmas Day Under Particularly Sad Circumstances

It is the "Sentinel's" duty to announce a particularly sad death this week in the passing of Mrs. Isadore Sara at their ranch home at Roberts Creek, Eureka County, at 2 a. m. on December 25.

She died of what is termed eclampsia, a condition characterized by severe convulsions and occurs in women only during pregnancy. This is a rare and dangerous disease, happening only once in about 600 cases, and is due to the liver and kidneys being unable to perform their proper functions. Mrs. Sara had ten convulsions before the arrival of Dr. Brennen of Eureka, and was unconscious from the first one until relieved by death. Dr. Brennen performed an operation to terminate pregnancy, in an effort to relieve the condition.

Since a severe attack of the flu at the Mayo Bros' hospital at Rochester, Minn., a year ago last Fall, Mrs. Sara has not enjoyed good health, and Mr. Sara had her in San Francisco under medical treatment for a number of months, bringing her and the children home last September.

She was particularly affable, genteel and of ladylike ways and manners, and during her visits and residence in Eureka at intervals formed acquaintances and friends whose sincere sympathy and condolence will be extended the stricken husband and three young children.

She was a native of Aldudes, France, and 36 years, 7 months and 28 days of age; was reared and educated in her home land, those ties being deeply implanted within her. She was a devoted wife and mother, and her place in the home cannot be filled.

Besides her husband and three young children, she is survived by a father, mother and one brother in France; four brothers, Peter, Leon, John and Joannes Ardans, all living in Nevada; and two sisters, Mrs. Pierre Lexague and Mrs. Pierre Sansinena, residing in Cedarville, California.

To permit of the arrival of distant relatives the funeral will be held in Eureka next Tuesday forenoon.
