

Early Southland Family Member Taken by Death

SAN CLEMENTE, Jan. 29. Mrs. Ysidora Echenique, 75, of 155 Barcelona St., member of an early Southern California family, died last night at St. Joseph's Hospital, Orange, after a short illness.

Rosary will be recited at 7:30 p.m. Monday at San Juan Capistrano Mission. Requiem Mass will be celebrated at 9 a.m. Tuesday at the mission.

Born Near Riverside

Mrs. Echenique was born Ysidora Forster, daughter of Marco F. and Guadalupe Avila Forster, at the historic Santa Margarita Ranch near Oceanside which her parents owned at the time and which comprised some 300,000 acres, most of which is now Camp Pendleton.

When the Flood and O'Neill interests acquired the ranch, the family moved to San Juan Capistrano. In 1902 she married the late Cornelio Echenique, who operated many of the vast ranch holdings in the San Juan Capistrano area still retained by the family.

Shortly before his death in 1948 Mr. and Mrs. Echenique moved to San Clemente. Mrs. Echenique was the last of her generation of the Forster family.
